They are right around the corner if and only if we are willing to put use the teachings of Christ to care and love our neighbor.

Will you join me this year in making Trinity UCC in Coplay the center of the community in which Christ's teachings are made real in the word and actions of our members? May we all have a Happy and Prosperous New Year!



Monthly Mission of the Month (MOM):

January: Our Church's Needs—Offering received is used for the needs of Trinity whether special projects or other miscellaneous needs. Donations in 2011: \$303; in 2012: \$221.

February: A Plus Pediatric Clinic at Trinity UCC Coplay—Used to fund first-time visits for people without insurance and other miscellaneous clinic needs. Donations in 2011: \$245; in 2012: \$173.

Annual Report—Stewardship Team

Fund-raisers have been a primary focus of the Stewardship Team this year with the Basket Bingo, Nut Roll sale, Sam Owens Night, Hickory Grove Sale, Yard Sale, Coplay Community Days, and Craft Fair. Along with cookbook sales and Redner's Sav-A-Tape program, fund-raisers have yielded approximately \$4000. Thanks to all who continue to support Trinity!

Additionally, oversight of property maintenance has been an important function of this team. Chimney maintenance is planned, conversion to gas heat is complete, building and grounds repairs continue to be scheduled. Our church bell chime clock was graciously repaired as a donated service; thank you to those involved! The property team includes Dale Donovan, Scott Heffelfinger, Jason Griffith, and Lee Zettlemoyer.

We continue to lease part of our Parish House to Dr. Gavin for A Plus Pediatrics. Presently, we are looking into leasing our church kitchen to Cupcakes and S'mores, an online cupcake business owned by Melanie Doll, former Girl Scout and leader at our Trinity troops.

Goals for 2014 include updating church members' records, surveying time and talent interests of members, and revising our church by-laws.

As of June, the co-leaders of this team are Lisa Griffith and Vanessa Miller.

Annual Report—Hospitality Team

Visitation Team has become very active this year under the leadership of Pastor Steve, Janice Geider, and Grace Balliet. Our monthly teams have consistently visited those unable to attend church, and are available for emergency circumstances. Grace Balliet coordinates the telephone ministry and the home meal delivery ministry. Ruth Thomson and Grace continue to visit residents of Phoebe Home weekly.

Easter breakfast, complimentary breakfast and lunch at our yard sale event, and lunch for the community at our annual Blessing of the Pets service have been provided as community outreach.

We have volunteered at and donated food to the Northampton Area Food Bank, donated blood to Keystone Miller Blood Bank, donated shoes for the Whitehall Relay for Life fund-raiser, donated pet items to the Lehigh County Humane Society, donated 81 shoeboxes this year to Operation Christmas Child, and donated 75 rainbow scarves to the National Synod for antibullying awareness and action. 20 residents of Phoebe Home have had Christmas gift wishes fulfilled by donors. Unsold yard sale items were donated to American Family Services. Monies collected with our "Mission of the Month" collections assist across an entire spectrum of agencies (see bi-monthly newsletters for information).

We provide meeting space for 2 Girl Scout troops, and they assist us with gifts for use by our Visitation Team and donations to our various missions.

The Decorating Team has continued to decorate our sanctuary with palms, Easter flowers, poinsettias, and Christmas decorations.

We are well known beyond our community for our prayer ministry and are known as a warm and welcoming family of faith. We continue to plan activities in 2014 to strengthen the "community" in our church and impact on our community-at-large.
