#### **PURPOSE**

The avowed purpose of this Congregation shall be to Worship God, Preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and Celebrate the Sacraments. To Promote the Christian Life; to Render Loving Service toward mankind both at home and abroad; To Strive for Righteousness, Justice and Peace; and To Advance the Kingdom of God by all available means both at home and throughout the world.

### July / August 2013

#### **PASTOR'S TWO CENTS:**

For those of you who did not attend June 2<sup>nd</sup>'s congregational meeting that outlined our needs and our future I will be happy to use my article to give you a short recap of the meeting. Those of you who were there can use this time to take a closer look and remember the imperatives that were given so that we all can realize the severity of our situation.

Consistory President, Janet Ebert advised us that we can no longer depend on our fundraising revenues to bridge the gap between our weekly offerings and our daily expenses in the general budget. Janet explained that for the last 2 years that she, Jim Ebert, Roni Caciolo, Dawn Hummel and Pastor Steve have been attending the Penn Northeast Conference's Church Renewal program which has a final year to complete. She also explained that Pastor Steve attended the Penn Northeast Conference's Annual meeting and was privileged to hear some amazing work that is being conducted by Cameron Trimble on rebuilding churches.

It was at this time that I gave my report on Cameron's research. In a nut shell she taught us that we as a church need to find our purpose, our niche, our mission in the community. This is a vital element for church survival in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. She noted that people who are joining churches are looking for a church that is doing something for the community it serves.

We noted that not only is our church open and affirming but we also have been very community oriented. We are utilizing our Parish House for a Pediatric Clinic and our monthly mission offerings are designated for either local, national or world missions that serve our community near and far. But it doesn't seem to be addressing a current need of our local community that might make others take notice or care what we are doing.

Recently we received a donation of 6 computers; 1 from the Morning Call Angel list and 5 from Pat Kern's current employer. These computers could allow us to teach our elderly congregation how to email and help low income students in our area have access to more computers here in their community. Then we heard some shocking news. 17% of the youth in Coplay are on Juvenile Probation. This is a need that cries out to be addressed.

So, the Consistory decided to look into developing a Technology Center on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Parish House so to work directly with the Juvenile Probation departments of Lehigh and Northampton counties to give these children an opportunity to give back to those who could benefit from their computer knowledge while giving them a place OFF THE STREETS to spend time in a worthwhile endeavor.

We also felt it would be good to contact one of the area Hospital Centers to inquire about adding Pediatric mental health counseling in conjunction with Dr. Gavin's pediatric medical practice. Now, while this seems like a large undertaking we believe from the research provided by Cameron Trimble that this is exactly what this church needs and is definitely what this community needs.

Your input and feedback is not only needed but is being requested so that we can look at all aspects; good and bad of this endeavor. There is more I could report but this should get some good conversations started for the summer.

Finally, I need to report that the Thursday night worship services are ending as of June 28<sup>th</sup>. July, August and part of September we will be hosting the Communities That Care initiative for Family building. We will be providing a space for these families to meet and will facilitate a family building educational course. Then in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of September we are planning a Saturday night worship service on either a monthly or bi-monthly basis to see what the response is to this service.

Thursday night service was designed to give those members who could not attend on a Sunday an additional opportunity to attend church. While we started out with 15 to 25 in attendance the numbers have shrunk to less than a handful of people. Either there is not an interest by our congregation or Thursdays are not a good night any longer. We had two to three people join us from the community who were not members and we are hopeful they will continue to attend on the new night.

I and the Consistory are determined to do whatever is necessary to bring new ideas and progressive responses to our dwindling attendance and revenue so to keep the doors of Trinity UCC in Coplay open for a long time. Obviously, we can only do it with your help. Many in the congregation are also very committed to this cause but the question is whether there is enough "other" congregational interest or spirituality to continue this ministry into the future. Time and the grace of God will tell!

#### Congregational Meeting 6-2-13

Good Morning! May I please have a show of hands for all the members? (36) Thank you. The June 2, 2013 will please come to order.

- 1. We have identified a communication gap here at Trinity; we will work to close this gap. First, Marvin Mann officially resigned as Consistory president earlier this year; I am now the Consistory president. We are in need of a vice President and an alternate for Consistory.
- 2. Lisa Griffith and Vanessa Miller have replaced me as leaders of the Stewardship Team.
- 3. Pastor Steve and Dawn now live in Bloomsburg. Consistory meetings will be held monthly on the second Monday of the month at Pastor Steve's request when he is in the Lehigh Valley for PNEC monthly meeting; this was voted upon by Consistory. You are always invited to visit these meetings to bring concerns or questions, or to observe.
- 4. We have received feedback regarding our church announcement format. As you recall, announcements were moved to the projection system due to feedback about the lengthy verbal announcements during service; an unexpected advantage was that the print could became larger in the bulletin. The disadvantages are that you need to come early to see the announcements and we no longer have a hand held copy to use. Consistory requests a vote as to whether the announcements should continue to be shown on the screens before church, or return to the bulletin. All those in favor of using the projection system before church, raise your hand. (21) All those in favor of using the bulletin for announcements, raise your hand. (6)

A suggestion was then made to scroll the announcements at the end of service; anyone who missed the earlier ones will be able to review them; this was initiated today.

- 5. Donations are 23 % less this year than last year at this time. In April, Pat, our treasurer, needed to use \$1450 from the fund-raising account to pay bills, leaving \$1750 in that account. As of 12/31/12, we had \$3400 in fund-raising. Our next fund-raiser is in 2 weeks, our annual yard sale. We need your help with donations of items to sell. Also, fuel fund donations are not meeting the costs, even with our conversion to gas. This year gas costs are \$433/mo and donations are \$170/month. Our assets are: we are not in debt, and we have a 56-month \$20,000 CD that we always use as collateral. As I reported to you last September 2 our doors are being kept open by our donations, our fund-raising activities, and supplemental income from Dr. Gavin's rent. At this time, Dr. Gavin's rental agreement is monthly, and as such could end at any time if she decides to close or move to a different location. I will continue to keep you updated on our church's financial standing.
- 6. What is the answer to all of this? Ask a friend to church. Do your best with your donations. And this summer the Stewardship Team and Hospitality Teams will be planning an all-member Stewardship Campaign to be started at the beginning of September and to end on Stewardship Sunday in November.
- 7. Lastly, Pastor Steve, Dawn, Roni, Jim, and Janet continue to attend PNEC "Renew Our Church" program given by Alan Miller. We are learning that churches with a specific purpose or goal for service to the community are the ones providing a place for people as they move along their spiritual journey and find meaning in their personal lives. Pastor Steve shared information given at the PNEC Annual meeting and Consistory has asked him to share it with you.

Are there any other questions, statements or business to discuss before adjourning? And if there are no other items, may I have a motion to adjourn? (Barb Miller) Is there a second to that motion? (Kathleen Ebert) All in favor say "aye". Opposed? Motion carried. Thank you for your time and attention.


